## **INTERMATIC INC. Announces Recall of Nightlights**

Intermatic Inc. of Spring Grove, IL, is voluntarily recalling about 8,000 electroluminescent nightlights. The nightlights (also sometimes called guide lights) were manufactured in a way that could cause them to short circuit, posing shock and burn hazards to a consumer under certain circumstances.

While there have been no reported injuries associated with these products, as a precaution Intermatic is asking consumers to stop using the nightlights and return them to Intermatic for a full refund.

The recalled Electroluminescent Night Lights have model numbers GN172 and GN165, which are printed on the back of the lights. The model GN172 lights are gray in color and are about 1 ½ inches square by ¼ inch thick with two metal electrical prongs. The model GN165 lights are gray in color and are about 4 3/8 inches in height, 1 5/8 inches wide and ¼ inch thick with two metal prongs. Also indicated on the back of the nightlights are the words, “Intermatic, Inc.” and “Made in Taiwan”.

Retail stores and electrical distributors sold these nightlights between January, 1999 and December, 2001 for about \$5.

Consumers should stop using these lights immediately and are advised to turn off the power before removing the nightlight from the wall socket. Consumers can mail the lights to Intermatic Inc., c/o Intralec, 1200 Cardiff Boulevard, Mississauga, Ontario L5S1P6, Attn: Larry Kubisiak, for a full refund or a replacement nightlight of similar style and comparable value.
