WarmlyYours Recalls Rug Warmers Due to Fire Hazard

Toronto, ON – The Electrical Safety Authority in cooperation with WarmlyYours is notifying the public that WarmlyYours has announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled product immediately.

Name of Product: ComfortsPlus Under Area Rug Warmer (Warmer)

Units: 30 in Canada.

Manufacturer/Importer: WarmlyYours, of Long Grove, IL, U.S.A.

Hazard: The rug warmer’s cord can come loose from the plug and cause sparks or flames, posing a fire hazard to consumers.

Incidents/Injuries: There were two reported incidents. One involved electrical sparks coming from the cord when it was pulled out. In the other incident, the cord caught fire and left burn marks on the area rug and floor. No injuries have been reported.

Description/Models: The Warmers come in three sizes (see below) and have a cream colored non-slip pad on the top and bottom with a tan nylon edging and a black electrical cord.

When was distributed: Product was sold from October 2006 through December 2007.

Manufactured in: China

Remedy: Consumers should stop using the rug warmers immediately, unplug it, and return the cord to WarmlyYours using the pre-paid shipping packet (envelope and postage labels) that the firm will provide for a full refund or a replacement product. WarmlyYours is directly contacting purchasers of the warming rugs.
