Home Hardware Recalls Infinita Kettle Due to Possibility of Overheating.

Toronto, ON – The Electrical Safety Authority is notifying the public that Home Hardware has announced that they will continue to support the original recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately.

Name of Product: Infinita kettle model EK814L with date code beginning with 07. The SKU number is 3842-499

Units: Approximately 2046 units were sold in Canada

Manufacturer/Importer: Emperor Household Electrical Appliance Co. Ltd.

Hazard: Kettle could overheat, could melt base and pose a fire hazard.

Incidents/Injuries: There have been 3 reported incidents of fire, 2 of which have alleged property damage.

Description/Models: Infinita kettle model EK814L stainless steel kettle with date code beginning with 07. (The model number is printed on the rating label on the bottom of the kettle.)

Sold by: Home Hardware

When was distributed: 2007 to March 2009

Manufactured in: China

Remedy: Consumers should stop using the product immediately and contact Home Hardware for a credit for the value of the product at the time of purchase.
