Wal-Mart Canada Corp. Recalls GE® 14-cup Food Processors Due to Laceration Hazard

The Electrical Safety Authority is notifying the public that Wal-Mart Canada Corp. has announced a voluntary recall of the following consumer product. Consumers should stop using recalled products immediately.

Name of Product: General Electric® - Branded 14-cup Food Processor model # 169224.

Units: 18,983 in Canada.

Manufacturer/Importer: Demeter Enterprise Co. /Wal-Mart Canada Corp.

Hazard: There is a potential failure of the product’s safety interlock system, allowing the food processor to be operated without the lid in place, posing a laceration hazard to consumers.

Incidents/Injuries: Wal-Mart Canada has received approximately 3 reports of the food processor engaging without the lid in place resulting in laceration injuries to the user’s fingers.

Description/Models: The GE-branded 14-cup food processors are black with stainless steel. The Model Number 169224 can be found on the base of the unit.

Sold by: Wal-Mart Canada Corp.

When was distributed: From August 2009 to December 2010.

Manufactured in: China

Remedy: Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled Food Processor and return the product to any Wal-Mart Canada Retail Store for a full refund

Consumer Contact: Return to the nearest Wal-Mart Canada Retail Store for a full refund.
